

## **General admission information for all education programs**

Wingate University's School of Graduate and Adult Education offers rolling admissions for the three semesters— fall semester, spring semester, and two summer sessions.

Students who submit their information and meet all of the requirements for admission will be admitted with full acceptance into the program they have selected.

Admission may be granted with provisional status by the Graduate Education Program Admission Committee if the application materials are not complete. However, the missing information must be completed within the first six hours of the program.

A student provisionally admitted is missing one or more of the requirements for admission. If admitted to the program on provisional status, the student must make no less than a "B" on the first six hours of coursework attempted and can only take up to six hours of coursework before completing the requirements. If the student admitted on provisional status makes less than a "B" on the first six hours of coursework, the student will not be able to register for courses the following semester. In order to continue in the program after that time, the student must submit a written request to the Director of Graduate Education Programs, who will present the matter to the Teacher Education Committee for consideration. The appeal must be received at least one month prior to the term for which the student wishes to enroll.

If a student is denied regular or provisional admission he/she may request special admissions consideration by the Teacher Education Committee. Requests for special admission consideration must be made in writing to the Director of Graduate Education Programs at least one month prior to the semester for which the student is seeking admission. The request, presented by the Director of Graduate Education program to the committee for action, should contain information helpful to the committee in making its decision (for example: work experience, professional activities, etc.).

Students have up to six years to complete their program of study and earn their degree/certification.
